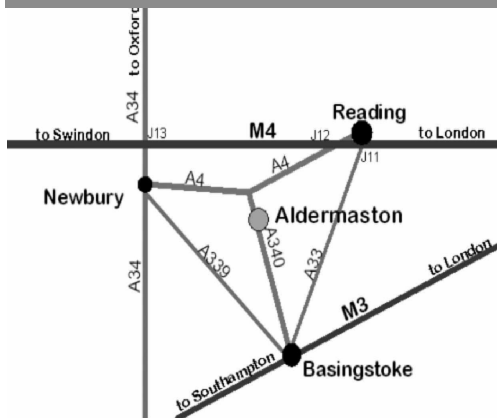

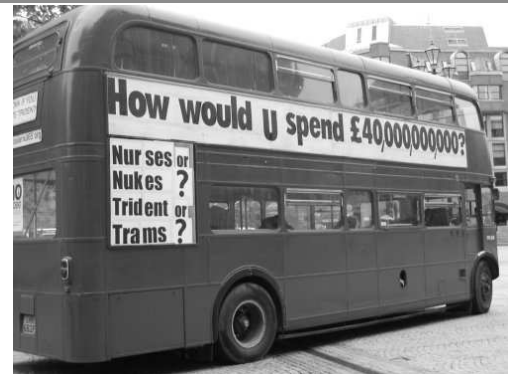

Getting There

Although AWE describes itself as 'Aldermaston', most of its entrances and meeting points for protests and demos are closer to the village of Tadley.

Groups will need to make their way to different gates. Each gate will be taken by different geographical regions and blocs, and will have a theme reflecting one of the decades of the 50 years of protest. If you are arriving alone, choose the gate/decade theme to suit you.



Coaches

We hope that many groups across the country will be organising coaches to the protest. Details of coaches will be posted on our website – if there is no coach planned from your area how about organising one? See the MOBILISING section for more information about how to do this.

Details of coach drop off points will be sent out and put on our website nearer the time.

By Bus

As far we are aware there are no bus services to the area on Easter Monday. We will check again nearer the time with the local bus companies.

By Train

Nearest train stations are Aldermaston and Mortimer (latter more frequently served), but unless you want a long walk from the station it may be better to find other forms of transport.

We hope to organise a limited shuttle service to and from the nearest train stations. Call us or check the website nearer the time.

By Car

Please try to travel by other means. Check first whether there is collective transport organised from your region (and consider organising if not – see above) or arrange a car share with some other people in the area.

If coming via the M4, exit at Junction 12, follow the A4 towards Newbury and look out for the left turning to AWE Aldermaston on the A340, off a small roundabout about 6 miles from the M4.

Car parking information will be given nearer the time when we have finalised the details with the police and the local authorities.
